AzTAP Services:

- * **Demonstrate** AT devices
- * **Consultations** to help individuals find the right technology for their needs
- * **Lend out** devices for short term use
- * Operate **on-line equipment re-use** programs
- * Provide affordable **financial loan\$** to help people buy technology
- * **Training, education & technical assistance** to individuals, organizations, agencies and businesses

AzTAP Mission:

- To connect people with disabilities with the **assistive technology** they need to participate as fully as possible in activities that matter to them.



Assistive Technology (AT) Defined:

AT Device:

- Any item, piece of equipment or product system whether acquired commercially off the shelf, modified or customized that is used to increase or improve functional capacities of individuals with disabilities.

AT Service:

- Any service that directly assists an individual with a disability in the selection, acquisition or use of assistive technology.




Assistive Technology Supports a Person's Ability To:

- Guided, face to face, hands-on exploration of devices & features
- Assists consumer in the decision making process



Consultations

- Individualized, one on one sessions with an assistive technology specialist at our center or at client's location (home, office, school)





Devices are loaned to borrowers for 2 weeks

Items are available for pickup or are shipped at no cost to the borrower

Loans help people decide whether the equipment is right for them – prior to purchase

What is AT?
AT is defined as **Assistive Technology** and means any item, piece of equipment or product system, whether acquired commercially off the shelf, modified, or customized, that is used to increase, maintain, or improve the functional capabilities of a person with a disability.

What is DME?
DME is **Durable Medical Equipment** and is generally defined as sturdy, long lasting items and appliances that can withstand repeated use, are designed primarily to serve a medical purpose and are not generally useful to a person in the absence of a medical condition, illness or injury.

SEED Loans

- Financing AT for use by a person with a disability for:
 - Self-care independence
 - Education
 - Community living
 - Participation in activities of one's own choosing
 - Improved quality of life
- Financing equipment and/or AT to support **employment** of an individual with a disability as:
 - An employee
 - An independent contractor
 - Teleworker
 - Self-employed/entrepreneur

Independence is priceless; we make it affordable

Arizona Loan\$ for Assistive Technology



- Low interest rates
- No prepayment penalties
- Flexible length of repayment (1 – 5 years)
- Assistance with completing application
- Identification of other possible \$\$ sources
- Guidance with device selection and identifying vendors
- Intervention options to avoid loan default

Criteria: Demonstrate ability to repay loan:

- Sufficient monthly income and credit worthiness
