HOW ARIZONANS WITH I/DD CAN CAST THEIR VOTE FOR THE 2020 ELECTION

- Deadline to register to vote is Oct. 15
- Register to vote at https://bit.ly/2ZYWCet
- Deadline to request a ballot-by-mail: Oct. 23
- Complete vote-by-mail ballot; return it <u>as</u> <u>soon as possible</u>
- Last day to return vote-by-mail ballots: Oct.
 25; after October 25, use drop off box or polling location
 - Eligible voters with I/DD can vote.
 - Group home staff are responsible for the transportation of DDD member to the polling location.
 - Early ballots must be returned by the voter, a family member, household member or designated caregiver. (A.R.S. § 16-1005) <u>This</u> <u>may include group home staff.</u>
 - Polling locations offer accessible parking and are accessible to individuals in a wheelchair, as well as those with visual or hearing difficulties.
 - Polling locations will have accessible voting equipment.
 - If unable to fill out voter registration form or early ballot, DDD member can ask for help from a willing person of their choice.
 - Assistance at the polling location can come from the poll workers, or someone the DDD member chooses.
 - For election concerns for people with disabilities, call the Arizona Center for Disability Law (ACDL) at 602-274-6287 6am-7pm on election day.

 - Contact your County Recorder's Office for information, eligibility and availability on voting from home through a Special Elections Board. Individuals from two different political parties will come to you to assist you in casting your vote.

If you have limited guardianship, you CAN vote.

If you have full guardianship, you cannot vote under AZ law.
